Children experiencing homelessness are four times more likely to show delayed development and twice as likely to have learning disabilities as other children\*.

We provide a safe and stable place to call home while parents sort through the personal or economic problems that led to homelessness. We then help families find permanent housing and provide the support they need to succeed.


