Frequently Asked Questions	Answers
<p>A student has been coded as “QRS” (Quarantine Receiving Services) but has not yet been invited to join their grade level google classroom. What can I do about this?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Double check that the student is indeed coded as QRS. If the student is coded as ‘absent’ or ‘QNS’, they will not receive the invite to the Google Classrooms. ● Double check that the student is showing up as being in Quarantine in the Frontline system as well. ● Wait 24 hours. Generally, invitations to join Google Classrooms are sent out once a day. It is possible that the student was coded after the daily invites went out. ● Advise the student/family to check the student’s JCPS email. The invitation to join the classroom will be sent there. ● If all else fails, contact Brent Lynch at brent.lynch@jefferson.kyschools.us.
<p>How does a student gain access to the Quarantine Google Classroom?</p>	<p>Students will receive invitations to join their grade level google Classroom in their JCPS email, <i>and</i> on the landing page of Google Classroom.</p>
<p>What instruction will the student have access to while in Quarantine?</p>	<p>There are 2 pieces of instruction students are required to have access to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Asynchronous instruction: This part of instruction can be fulfilled in one of two ways. The classroom teacher MAY (IF THEY CHOOSE TO) assign tasks, videos, etc. to the student via the teacher’s digital platform while the student is in quarantine. If the teacher chooses not to assign any asynchronous work to the student, the student will have access to a new choiceboard each week complete with grade level tasks and activities. ● Teacher-student interaction (Synchronous instruction): Each student must have access to at least 3 hours of teacher-student interaction per week. In order to decrease the burden on classroom teachers, district

	<p>resource teachers will be hosting at least 3 hours of live lessons for each grade level each week. The menu of live lessons as well as their dates and times will be posted in each grade level Google Classroom each week. Whether the student is receiving asynchronous instruction from their classroom teacher or via the weekly choiceboards, students should attend at least 3 hours of live lessons (from their Quarantine Google Classroom) each week.</p>
<p>What if a student is assigned work from their classroom teachers?</p>	<p>If a student has asynchronous work assigned to them from their school they should complete that asynchronous work. The student should attend the synchronous live sessions with those in their quarantine Google Classrooms. The school assigned work replaces the asynchronous work/choice boards in the Google classrooms, but not the synchronous live lessons.</p>
<p>If a student is completing choice boards to complete their asynchronous instructional requirement while in quarantine, how do they turn it in?</p>	<p>Students will submit assignments completed while in quarantine to their classroom teacher upon their return to school.</p>
<p>How is the student's asynchronous work graded?</p>	<p>Legally, only the teacher of record can issue grades. If the student is completing asynchronous work offered by their classroom teacher, their classroom teacher may give grades. If the student is completing the asynchronous choice boards in their grade level Google classroom, students should bring that work back to their classroom teacher to be graded. District resource teachers managing the Quarantine Grade level Google classrooms will be giving students feedback, but can not give students grades.</p>
<p>What if a student needs help completing assignments?</p>	<p>Each Google classroom will offer a live lesson focused on going over and supporting students with the weekly choice boards. Students may also message any of the teachers linked to their Google Classroom.</p>
<p>Will students be removed from the Google</p>	<p>Students will be removed from the classroom</p>

<p>Classroom when they return to their school from Quarantine?</p>	<p>48-72 hours after their reported “approved to return to school” date.</p>
